# Recipient Rights Corner



ExpertCare would like to first thank you for providing the highest quality care to your Recipient. ExpertCare wants to ensure the safety of our Recipients and continue to give you the tools to provide safe, quality care and wellbeing. Below are incidents that resulted in Recipient Rights violations. Please review the following Rights reminders to prevent further violations.

- ⇒ A Recipient of mental health services shall not be subjected to abuse or neglect. This includes, but is not limited to, the use of unreasonable force on a Recipient by a Caregiver. For example, a Caregiver can't hold back a Recipient as a form of physical management. This would be an Abuse Class II substantiation which is defined as: the use of unreasonable force on a Recipient by an employee, volunteer, or agent of a provider with or without apparent harm. Physical management means a technique used by staff to restrict the movement of a Recipient by direct physical contact in order to prevent the Recipient from harming himself, herself, or others. Unreasonable force means physical management or force that is applied by an employee, volunteer, or agent of a provider to a Recipient in one or more of the following circumstances:
- i. There is no imminent risk of serious or non-serious physical harm to a Recipient, staff, or others.
- ii. The physical management is not in compliance with techniques approved by the provider and the responsible mental health agency.
- iii. The physical management used is not in compliance with the emergency interventions authorized in the Recipient's individual plan of service.
- iv. The physical management or force is used when other less restrictive measures were possible but not attempted immediately before the use of physical management or force.

When providing care to a Recipient there are many rules that need to be followed and at times these can be difficult to remember. If you have questions or concerns about your case or do not fully understand the IPOS, please call ExpertCare. We are here to help you better understand the Recipient's Rights before it becomes a violation. We appreciate your attention to this matter. Elisabeth: I'd want to fly so I could travel the world.


ECare: Share with us something new that you have learned in the last year.

### DIANE SANSALONE

ECare: What made you decide to become a Caregiver?

Diane: A neighbor needed someone to help with his bedridden wife, after she passed, I de-

cided to stay with it and found ExpertCare.

ECare: What have you always wanted to try and never did?

Diane: Hmmm...riding a motorcycle cross country, stopping at amusement parks, riding as

many roller coasters as I can along the way or skydiving.

ECare: What have you learned from your Caregiving experience that has helped you in other aspects of your life?

Diane: Patience. No matter what is going on in my life, someone may have it worse or has more challenges than me, which makes my role that much more important.



### LOOK WHO'S TALKING

### EXPERTCARE THERAPIST OF THE QUARTER

#### CASSANDRA WHITEAKER

ECare: What is the most rewarding experience you have had as an Occupational Therapist?

Cassandra: There are a lot! Many of the most rewarding have revolved around food. I have worked with newborns who couldn't feed properly and after some oral exercises and teaching adaptations, they are successful! I love seeing the joy in parents' faces when their child can take bites of food or adds a new food to their diet.

ECare: What's something you've always wanted to try but never did? Cassandra: I really want to try skiing or snowboarding!!

ECare: What is the most interesting experience you have had as an Occupational Therapist?

Cassandra: I was working in a sub-acute setting assessing safety during showering for an elderly gentleman. He began washing his front side, I then reminded him not to forget about his backside. He starts washing his backside and freezes. With all the concern in the world he exclaims that he is broken and needs the doctor. I quickly question what's wrong. He explains that he has a crack in his butt that was never there before! I hold it together enough to explain that it has indeed been there his entire life, everyone has a butt crack, and its necessary to poop. He doesn't buy it, but after several minutes of convincing and redirecting he does carry on washing. I walked back to the staff office, and we all died laughing!

ECare: What are your hobbies outside of work?

Cassandra: I love to be outside working in my garden, playing/ watching/ coaching sports with my 5 kids, or volunteering at my church.

ECare: What are three foods you can't live without?

Cassandra: Is coffee a food? it comes from a bean! My favorites change by the season, but currently I can't live without fruit (any kind), hamburgers (with lots of pickles) and chocolate peanut butter ice cream cones!

ECare: What is the first concert you attended?

Cassandra: I think it was a country concert when I was young. But the first big concert that I really remember was a whole weekend of awesome Christian concerts with Skillet and Toby Mac at Alive festival!

ECare: What is your best piece of advice for other Occupational Therapists?

Cassandra: When you are having a hard time with a client, remember for the population we serve it is a marathon not a sprint. Big, quick change is rare, but tiny bits of change are happening if we look close enough. Also, if parents aren't doing their part of the deal, I remind them I am only with their kid 1-2 hours per week and they are with them 168 hours per week... it takes consistency to make change! 1-2 salads a week while eating junk food all the other meals doesn't help you get healthy, so why should that theory work with home program/ therapy activities?!? Repeated practice is necessary!!

ECare: What have you learned from your experience as an Occupational Therapist that has helped you in other aspects of your life?

Cassandra: Well, being an OT was a Motherhood game changer when my 2nd and 3rd kids came along. My 2nd kid had a ton of feeding issues and reflex integration issues, so I was able to do therapy at home... and with my 3rd kiddo, my love for research led me to dive into alternative ADHD treatments. Outside of that, I think it taught me more self-confidence as I got used to talking with physicians, insurance auditors, and support coordinators.



Cassie has been such a dedicated and valuable part of ExpertCare for the last 4.5 years. Our very first Therapist of the Quarter was an easy selection.

Cassie goes above and beyond for her recipients as well as the Occupational Therapy Assistants she supervises. The time and effort she puts in to teaching and educating is a demonstration of her love for OT. Her knowledge and experience make her an excellent mentor and therapist.

We could not be prouder to have Cassie out in the field representing ExpertCare in such a positive light. Thank you for your professionalism, leadership, and caring nature!
